We have a fourteen foot well in the cellar under our house which usually is deep enough to cope with any amount of rain that falls. But at the end of each winter, round about now, we begin to be a little nervous. Hearing of all the dreadful floods in the North of England as a result of storm Ciara, and more storms on the way, our thoughts are with those having to cope with the aftermath and to find the resources for the clear-up.

But fortunately, our well seems to have coped again so far - though it's no good for drinking now!

I was thinking about how wells are usually thought of as places of refreshment in the Bible because the land is often beset by drought. The water needs to be pure. Fresh water is vital to life for us. And so, the Bible talks about making sure we are sustaining our lives with water from good wells and producing fresh water for others too. This type of water is lifesaving.

Isaiah says, "With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation". (Ch. 12:3)

Life- giving water needs to come from a pure source. The trouble is that so often the storms of life bring debris and mud that we find it hard to clear away. Can I encourage you in this season of Lent to find some time to consider the offer that Jesus gives?

"Whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life." (John 4:14)
